GOOD SAMARITANS

Thank you to everyone in our community for showing God's love through your support of the Good Samaritan's ministries in 2024! With your help, we provided 5,414 hot meals (up 93% from 2023) and grocery loads to 2,526 families (up 18% from 2023). We are grateful for your time, talent, and treasure.

The addition of events in 2024 played a key role in increasing our services. We introduced a second monthly hot meal event in partnership with Gyro Thursdays, serving ~50 neighbors, alongside our main monthly event serving 100+ neighbors. Both hot meals will include food pantries in 2025!

We also revamped our Wednesday morning grocery distribution to offer a full-choice shopping experience in our gym, reducing food waste and best serving our clients. Thanks to all who helped us achieve a stable full-choice model last fall!

With more events on our calendar, we need your continued support. Volunteer positions are crucial to ensure clients are well-cared for and facilities are cleaned timely. The new pantry format is more inviting to volunteers, with most jobs indoors and requiring minimal lifting.

DON HUSAT

Many of our fellow parishioners are involved in charitable work in our communities in addition to devoting their time and talents to our Annunciation parish. This month we are highlighting a parishioner who exemplifies that dedication.

Don Husat was first chrismated into our church by Father George Bartz back in 1973. Don began his service to our parish by serving two terms on Parish Council in the late 1980s. He followed that up by joining the Graduates Dinner Committee and went on to chair that event for five years. Along with his wife Vi (Vacelia), the couple worked with the Silent Auction at our Festival and has continued to do that to this day, including serving as chair of the Festival Silent Auction for a number of years.

A dedicated historian and writer, Don took on the task of researching and writing the history of our Annunciation parish for the 100th Anniversary Album in 2016. He is now in the process of organizing and establishing archives of all available information about the history of our Annunciation parish, which will be housed in our church building to preserve that history for future generations.

Don has also devoted his energies to serve his hometown of Hudson, Ohio. He and two other officers of the Hudson Heritage Association formed a foundation in 2019 to save and restore the badly neglected Baldwin-Buss House, built on Hudson's Village Green in 1825. The foundation raised \$1.25 million in eight months and the Baldwin-Buss House, now restored to its former glory, had its grand opening this past October.
